Monthly Theme for October: Bear/Bravery




- Do what is right even when the consequences are unpleasant.


GRADE 2/3


Grade 4/5 students are working with tier 3 vocabulary words using the Frayer Model to break the word down into the definition, examples, non-examples and facts. Elizabeth School

We had a wonderful October in grade 1! In language arts, the students are busy practicing their alphabet knowledge. Students are learning the letter names, sounds and proper letter formation. They are also practicing applying their knowledge when reading and writing CVC words. Students are also working hard to learn to read and write high frequency words. High frequency words are words that appear most often in print. In math, students are increasing their understanding of numbers from 1 to 20. Students are learning that quantity can be represented in multiple ways. They are practicing counting forward by 15, starting at any number and backward by 15. A highlight of each week is fiddle class. The students enjoy working with Ms. Deanna every Wednesday and are learning so much!

What Happened in October....

Alberta Parks presented us with a wonderful demonstration about the local animals in our region. Students learned a lot of information about these animals, answered lots of questions, and were excited to be able to feel all the furs.

Grade 2/3





Greetings to all parents and quardians!

students have been working diligently to complete tasks in all subject areas.

In language arts- students are working on completing sentences using finger spacing and are working on blending sounds together to help read words and learn how to spell. LLI will be starting up to support reading, writing and fluency skills. In Math- students are using pattern blocks to build patterns that have cores and using grid paper to make colourful patterns. In Social- students are learning about different communities- Gr 2 is learning about Igaluit and how the people in the community use different modes of transportation. Students can then compare with their own community. Gr 3- are learning about global citizenship and what it means to be a Canadian citizen. In Science- students are learning about matter. Gr 2 are deciding on different materials that can absorb or repel water. They also did an experiment on what materials whether-flat or bumpy caught bubbles or made them pop. Gr 3 are learning to make wampum belts and how Indigenous peoples of Canada made their belts and how important they are.









This month in math grade 4 and 5 students have been working on addition and subtraction using large numbers. For literacy, students have been reading "A Rover's Story" which is a hybrid story told from the perspective of the Mars Rover. Students have also started writing a narrative story about the water cycle, pretending that they are a water droplet going through each of the steps along their journey. In science, we tested out homemade weather vanes to check the wind direction. We are very excited about Halloween and have made some spooky haunted house art. Next month we will be moving on to multiplication and division, and continue with narrative writing!



Grade 5/6







October has been filled with lots of exciting learning in Grade 5/6! We finished off our super fun Charlie and the Chocolate Factory Novel Study unit. The students enjoyed analyzing the silly characters and talking about the themes of hope, greed, and family. We have now started the novel 'Witches' and the students are continuing to work on their reading comprehension. We will also be writing some spooky Halloween story beginnings. In Math, students have finished their patterns and algebra units. Please ask your child to show you their unit tests. Next we are working on place value and adding and subtracting numbers. Social in Grade 6 is all about democracy and the Grade 5's are working on learning about the Regions of Canada. Science has been filled with learning about the sun and constellations. We have had lots of chances to take our learning outside! Grade 6 students are currently creating a pinch pot monster during option time!











This month we began our CTF classes every Friday with the grade seven's working with leather and completing various leather projects. Fiddle lessons have also started for the students. In Language Arts we are working on paragraph and summary writing and using reading strategies with short stories. In Math we are studying integers with operations. In Science we are continuing with our Plants for Food and Fibre unit, testing optimal conditions for plants to grow in. In SS we are learning about the European Explorers who came to Canada. In gym class we have started a unit on soccer skills. Next month we will start our novel study "The Island of the Blue Dolphins ".


