ECS continues to work on learning the letters and sounds of the alphabet and demonstrating awareness of the connections between reading, writing, and oral language. ECS is practising their fine motor skills and correctly printing the formations of uppercase and lowercase letters. Some students have began sorting vocabulary words based on beginning sounds. We are engaging in speaking and listening activities to share ideas about pictures stories and information we are learning.

In ECS, we are identifying numerals to 10, sorting objects based on colour shape or size, counting sequences and patterns within counting. Students are comparing quantities to determine which is more or less.













GRADE 1

December was a short but exciting month for students. Students had the opportunity to participate in many winter and Christmas themed activities in December. Some highlights are the Christmas Store, our classroom Christmas fun day, and the school Christmas Dinner. Students continue to work on solidifying their letter and sound knowledge and are working on applying this knowledge when reading and writing. Students continue to build their understanding of numbers to 100 and were introduced to addition in December. GRADE 2/3














In language arts- students have been working on blends and digraphs, reading comprehension, word recognition, and sounding out words in chunks in order to spell them. In Math— students are finishing up the number sense unit- they are continuing to work with ordering numbers up to 100 and place value. In Social- students are learning about different communities- Gr 2 are being introduced to the various communities of the past. Gr 3- are working on researching natural disasters around the world. In Science— Gr. 2 students are in the next unit which is light and sound. Gr 3 are learning about sublimation, change of states of matter and lastly the water cycle. 





OUR SCHOOL SURVEY RESULTS -Elementary

Effective Learning Time

Important concepts are taught well, class time is used efficiently, and homework and evaluations support course objectives.

 In this school, students rated effective classroom learning time 8 out of 10; the Canadian norm for these grades is 7.8.

Relevance

Students who find classroom instruction relevant to their everyday lives.

In this school, students rated relevance 7.3 out of 10; the Canadian norm for these grades is 7.3.

Rigor

Students who find the classroom instruction is well-organized, with a clear purpose, and with immediate and appropriate feedback that helps them learn.

In this school, students rated rigor 7.8 out of 10; the Canadian norm for these grades is 7.9.

Positive teacher-student relations


Students who feel teachers are responsive to their needs, and encourage independence with a democratic approach.

Average percentage in Language Arts


Students' overall marks in their current or most recent Language Arts class (e.g., English) were reported as a letter grade and converted to a percentage.


- In this school, students' average reported mark was 73%; the Canadian norm for these grades is 81%.

- In this school, girls' average reported mark was 77% and boys' was 82%. The Canadian norm for girls is 81% and for boys is 81%.






Average percentage in Science
